It isn't that Cathy Timberlake (Day) is above a bit of hanky-panky; it's just that she wants Phillip Shayne (Cary Grant) to provide a marriage license and wedding ring first. The high-powered supporting cast includes Gig Young as Roger, Philip's moralistic financial advisor; Audrey Meadows as Connie, Cathy's wise-cracking roommate; Alan Hewitt as Dr. Gruber, a confused psychiatrist; and John Astin as Beasley, Cathy's slimy would-be beau. They Shall Not Grow Old (2018) **Wednesday, June 19, 2pm**

Peter Jackson directed this homage to the British troops of the First World War with never-before-seen-footage of soldiers as they faced the fear and uncertainty of front-line battle in Belgium. Digitally remastered and now in color, the footage has been studied by lip reading experts whose transcripts were recorded and used as audio for the film. Overlaid by a narrative of those who partook in the war from interviews made in the 1960s and 1970s, this historic revisiting marks one hundred years since the end of the Great War.
